September ended with \$115K total funds available. Our 2006 budget predicted a year end balance of \$78.5K.

At current spending levels we should end the year around 45% under budget.

This reflects the savings from the following improvements in our business;

- Contracting to a more efficient, higher quality construction company for a major maintenance project
- Selecting a more competitive landscaping contractor
- Insurance expense was under budget
- Legal expenses are far under budget

#### REMEMBERING ARCHIE STONE

In the early morning hours of Sunday, October 22, Archie Stone died peacefully at home after a brief illness.

For those of us who had the privilege of having him as a good friend and neighbor his passing is a great loss. It is also a loss to those who have joined our association recently and did not have the opportunity to know him.

Archie and his beloved wife, Ida, moved to Ballena Bay in 1977 where Ida, a devoted "fisherperson", could enjoy the sport she learned to love while the family lived in Rio de Janeiro from 1969 until 1977. Ida died in August, 1995.

Archie took his BS in aeronautical engineering from Rennsalaer Polytechnic and married Ida shortly before joining the army in World War II. Following service in Italy as an Army Air Corps officer he received an MS in civil engineering from MIT and became a professional engineer. He was a senior executive with the engineering and construction firm, Morrison-Knudsen, where he specialized in the construction of large dams and hydroelectric projects. His work took him and the family to many foreign assignments including lengthy stays in Turkey and Brazil.

A lifelong scholar, world traveler and linguist, Archie continued his education by attending courses at UC Berkeley until recently, studying a wide range including linguistics, archeology, literature in several languages and other subjects. He spoke five languages and translated a friend's novel from Italian into English.

During his last days he was lovingly attended at home by his three sons, Tony, Tom and Jerry of whom he was very proud.

Archie was an outstanding member of our Board of Directors, fair and diplomatic, and worked diligently both on and off the Board for our association. He made use of his professional skills to keep our crumbling old docks repaired until they could be replaced. Many will miss his glorious clam chowder on New Year's Day and we will all miss him.
