Waterside Committee Report by Dick Bacigalupi

I want to wish everyone the best for the New Year and hope that using your boat more is one of your resolutions. We spend too much to buy and maintain them to let them sit idle. I also want to thank all those who put lights on their boats during the holiday season. They looked great.

While not real visible, your Waterside Committee has been busy. The wheels have been replaced on three ramps to prevent damage to the dock surface. Eventually everyone will have the new red plastic wheels. The new wheels may not be the most attractive color but they will have a longer life. Special thank goes to Rob Larsen who has been removing large pieces of drift wood that have come in with the storms. He has been towing them over to the high school instead having them rest against our boats and docks. It is not a happy site to see an old piling or large tree limb rubbing against your boat hull.

I am happy to announce that the wave maze repair and cleaning project is scheduled to begin in the next couple of weeks. Topper Construction, who built the wave maze, will be on site to do the work. The Waterside Committee has been doing minor repairs over the years replacing tires that have come loose. Unfortunately, some have been lost and new tires need to be added to maintain the proper floatation. In addition, it is now time to do a major cleaning removing the sediment and growth from the tires. Other than the minor cleaning by a diver a 3-4 years ago, this will be first major cleaning since the wave maze was installed. Over the years sediment has settled in the tires reducing the floatation and effectiveness of the wave maze. With the cleaning the wave maze will ride higher in the water exposing some marine growth. While unsightly, please be patient as it will dry up and eventually fall off. The best part is that the wave maze will be floating higher, much more effective with a longer life. Like our homes, the wave maze also needs maintenance.

Now we are definitely in winter everyone is reminded to make sure your boat is securely tied. Whenever possible it is recommended to use spring lines in addition to the bow and stern ties. Spring lines will take much of the shock preventing damage to the boat and dock.

Everyone have a fun safe time on the water and be sure to dress warm...its winter
