Disaster Preparedness for Alzheimer's Caregivers

People with Alzheimer's disease can be especially vulnerable during earthquakes such as severe weather, fires, floods, earthquakes, and other emergency situations. It is important for caregivers to have a disaster plan that includes the special needs of people with Alzheimer's as these impairments in memory and reasoning severely limit their ability to act appropriately in crises.

You can customize a disaster kit for your family using these items as necessary:

- Pillow, blanket, or other comfort item the person can hold.
- · Favorite snacks and high-nutrient drinks
- Physician's name, address, and phone number
- Waterproof bags to hold medications and copies of legal, medical, insurance, and Social Security documents.
- Recent photos of the person in case you are separated.
- Warm clothing and sturdy shoes, labeled for easy identification, incontinence garments, wipes and lotion
- Spare eyeglasses and hearing aid batteries
- · Flashlights and extra batteries.

Be sure to store your disaster kit in a watertight container where it can be easily accessed in an emergency.
